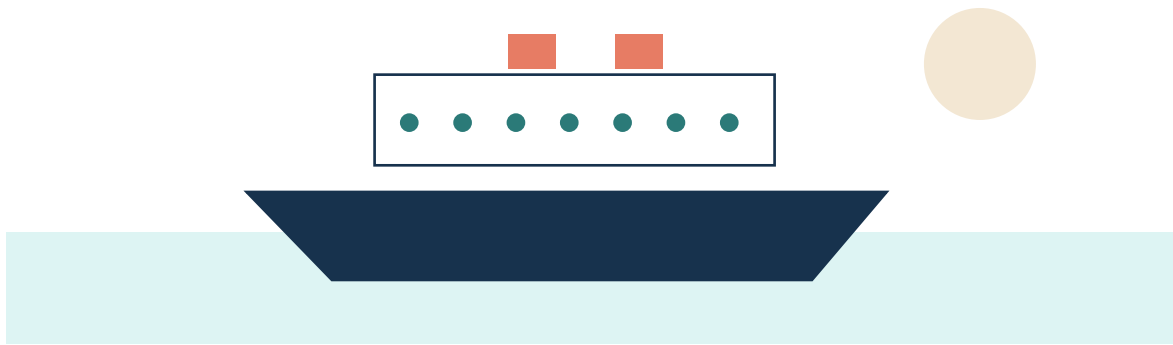




ALASKA CRUISE PACKING CHECKLIST

Layers, rain protection and port-day essentials for Alaska sailings

TIP

1. Layering System

- ☐ Base layers
- ☐ Long-sleeve shirts
- ☐ Fleece / mid-layer
- ☐ Light insulated jacket
- ☐ Waterproof rain shell
- ☐ Comfortable pants
- ☐ Warm socks
- ☐ Optional thermal layer

TIP

Alaska weather can shift quickly.

2. Footwear & Rain

- ☐ Water-resistant walking shoes
- ☐ Backup shoes
- ☐ Packable rain pants
- ☐ Hat with brim
- ☐ Small daypack
- ☐ Dry bags / zip bags
- ☐ Extra socks
- ☐ Compact umbrella

3. Wildlife & Scenery

- ☐ Binoculars
- ☐ Camera / phone
- ☐ Power bank
- ☐ Lens cloth
- ☐ Sunglasses
- ☐ Water bottle
- ☐ Offline maps
- ☐ Small notebook

TIP

Binoculars are especially useful for whales and shoreline wildlife.

4. Glacier Viewing

- ☐ Warm layer
- ☐ Windproof outer layer
- ☐ Gloves
- ☐ Beanie
- ☐ Binoculars
- ☐ Camera
- ☐ Deck-safe footwear
- ☐ Warm drink if desired

FINAL CHECK

- ☐ Check port weather
- ☐ Rain shell in carry-on
- ☐ Binoculars accessible
- ☐ Camera charged
- ☐ Documents verified
- ☐ Cruise app downloaded
